Verdict: Accepted

This submission concerns the occurrence of a Great Shearwater *Puffinus gravis* at sea off Port Kembla, near Wollongong NSW (34° 36′.20 S, 151° 04′.56 E) on the 23rd April 2011. The bird was captured and banded by SOSSA (Southern Ocean Study Association) with band number 300-00154.

The description and photographs leave no doubt as to the bird's identity. Members voted unanimously in favour of acceptance.

This is the 8th confirmed record for Australia. This sighting, along with many others reported between February and April 2011, may form part of an invasion of this species into Australian waters.
